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## Calistoga Depot celebrating grand (re)opening April 25



The historic Calistoga Depot will celebrate its grand opening on April 25 with the reopening of the Calistoga Depot Provisions under a new operator, and the grand opening of all of the experiences at the Calistoga Depot, which include the Distillery Bar and an outdoor beer and garden plus five train cars with culinary offerings.

The Calistoga Depot, California's second oldest train station, was built in 1868. The Calistoga Depot's reopening marks

the completion of a plan that started three years ago when Jean-Charles Boisset and Michael Madden were first inspired to restore and renovate the property.

Boisset bought the depot in 2021. The Provisions deli opened in Joly 2022 but closed last fall with a promised reopening this spring after completion of the depot's components. These comprise nine experiences and four distinct menus.

The Calistoga Depot Distillery Bar will offer spirits tastings, barrel tastings and craft cocktails with spirits from Boisset's Calistoga Depot Distillery that are inspired by the story of Calistoga's founder, Sam Brannan.

The bar, which boasts a full collection of locally distilled artisan spirits, launched in October 2023.

The Calistoga Depot Provisions will reopen as Calistoga Depot Provisions by



Nova Terra Kitchen & Creamery, featuring local artisanal producers, organic and environmentally conscious offerings, as well as a full menu of plant-based comfort food for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Nova Terra founders Brook and Terri Penquite are known for their small-batch, plant-based, hand-crafted cheeses featured at local wineries and the Oakville Grocery.

The Depot's train car experiences include the JCB Parlor Car serving Champagne, oysters and caviar.

A second train car, Casa Obsidiana, highlights Boisset's new tequila, also named Casa Obsidiana, and will showcase the diversity of Mexican cuisine and Oaxacan art.

The First Millionaire's Saloon pays homage to Sam Brannan and the saloons that he would have visited in the 19th century. It will feature the whiskeys, bourbons and brandies of the Calistoga Depot Distillery.

The Calistoga Depot Wine Merchant will offer wines and luxury spirits from wine producers in Calistoga, the Napa Valley and beyond, including products from noted craft distillers and well-known global selections.

Earth & Sky Chocolates, which has been producing its signature chocolates in a train car, will be open for retail sales.

In the backyard, a beer garden will feature local craft breweries and the menu offerings from each of the train cars.

The historical wine tasting room pays homage to every AVA of the Napa Valley and the foundation of Napa Valley's community. Create your wine journey through the valley by the taste, glass or flight.

The Vine Trail, a 47-mile walking, biking and trail system connecting the entire Napa Valley from Vallejo to Calistoga, ends at the Calistoga Depot, where Boisset is sponsoring a bike shelter. When complete, it will follow much of the path that Sam Brannan envisioned when he built the Napa Valley Railroad in 1868.

Planned hours are as follows:

- Calistoga Depot Provisions: 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Thursday to Monday. It is closed on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- Calistoga Depot Distillery, train cars, and backyard: 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday, Thursday and Sunday and 10 p.m. on Friday and Saturday. It is closed Tuesday and Wednesday.

# Land Trust buys 512 acres at Lake Berryessa

The Land Trust of Napa County has bought 512 acres near Lake Berryessa next to the 6,400-acre Cedar Roughs Wilderness Area managed by the federal Bureau of Land Management.

It is next to the nonprofit group's 1,150-acre Chiles Valley Preserve, which it bought in 2019 and enlarged in 2020.

The new acquisition contains serpentine soils that support rare plants that can



tolerate certain conditions, including low amounts of calcium, high amounts of magnesium, heavy concentrations of nickel and chromium and low nitrogen levels. No one wanted this land for vineyards!

The former landowner sold the property to the Land Trust for \$1 million. Its appraised value is \$1.7 million, providing him a charitable donation.

The Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation provided half the funds while the rest came from private donors.

The Land Trust now protects 94,000 acres or 17% of Napa County.

## Empress M dim sum pop-up opens in Oxbow Public Market

Chinese restaurant Empress M began a 6-month pop-up in Oxbow Public Market last Wednesday. It replaced Stateline Road Smokehouse, which is soon to open on Vallejo Street in Napa.

Empress M at Oxbow sells dim sum plates and a variety of authentic Sichuan dishes.

A dim sum platter contains three dumplings (har gao shrimp, shumai and spinach), two egg

rolls, spicy cucumber salad and pan fried noodles for \$18.99.

A chicken wings platter replaces the dumplings with spicy wings for \$21.99, and the vegetarian platter has two spinach dumplings, two eggrolls, wood ear salad, cucumber salad and the noodles for \$16.99.

Then there are dan dan noodles with beef for \$16.99, the components of the dinners individually and a few other tasty items.

They also serve boba teas and organic

beverages, and, of course, you can buy other beverages in stalls around the market.

They may make some changes after a little experience.

Nothing including menus seems posted online yet but surely will be soon.

#### Moro to open Wednesday in Oxbow Public Market

Chef Mourad Lahlou, founder and owner of both Aziza and Mourad in San Francisco, plans to open his new Moroccan restaurant Moro in Oxbow Public Market this Wednesday.

Inspired by the grab-and-go food of Mourad's childhood and the food stalls at Jemaa el-Fnaa, Marrakesh's famous night market, the Moroccan street food menu will feature grilled meats, flatbreads, salads and house-made dips made from fresh local ingredients.



"As a Napa resident, I felt now is the perfect time to bring this new concept to life," Mourad said. "Moro is a place built to gather your friends and family for a warm, delicious meal."

All summer long, The Grove restaurant will showcase pizza styles created by CIA alumni and guest chefs from series sponsor California Milk Advisory Board.

Featured pizza styles will change every

two weeks and guest chefs will drop by throughout the summer to make pizza on The Grove's outdoor terrace from June 1 to Sept. 9.

Patrons can try a variety of pizzas such as Napoletana, Roman al Taglio, Tonda Romana, Pinsa Romana, Padellino, Siciliana and Okonomiyaki style.

Summer of Pies will continue into the fall with American-style pizzas such as New York, Chicago (deep dish), Detroit Tavern, New Haven and California Neapolitan.

Chef David Nayfeld ('05) of San Francisco's Che Fico and Che Fico Alimentari will kick off the Summer of Pies with his Neapolitan-inspired pizza on Saturday, June 1.

"Our pizza (shown) is called Che Fico style because we truly engineered it to be what we wanted out of a pizza," Nayfield said. "It is more akin to a traditional natural fermented bread dough than a pizza dough from Italy. It's what delivers the taste and character that people have come to expect of our pies."

Summer of Pies will also feature Chef Leah Scurto, owner of PizzaLeah; Lars Smith, executive chef and co-owner of the State of Mind Restaurant Group in the Bay Area; and Glenn Cybulski, executive chef and pizzaiolo.

If you want to be scientific, you can get a free sound level meter app for your iPhone, created by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health, from the Apple App Store. It's called the NIOSH Sound Level Meter App.

BTW, the first high-tech company I worked for in 1968 charged \$575 for a meter that did that. That's \$5,203 today.

# **Luxury home in Oak Knoll with 100 vines for sale for \$9.95 million**

A 6,000-square-foot home with an outdoor swimming pool and 100 vines on a 1-acre lot at 1170 Darms Lane off Highway 29 has been listed for \$9.95 million according to *Decanter*.

An open-plan living space gives way to a terrace with a swimming pool area with an outdoor kitchen and bar.



It also includes a "small hobby vineyard" with Photo credit: Paul Rollins for Sotheby's 100 Cabernet Sauvignon vines, according to listing agent Ginger Martin of Sotheby's International Realty's St. Helena. That's really for a home winemaker, not commerce.

The property contains a main residence and a guest house built in 2022. It contains five bedrooms, a home theater, a hot tub and space for working at home.

Single-family homes in Napa County sold for a median price of \$989,500 in January 2024, up by 25% versus January 2023 and 7% higher than December 2023, according to the California Association of Realtors.

#### Napa Valley Writers' Conference

Authors whose works range across centuries from antiquity to contemporary society will gather this summer at the 43rd Napa Valley Writers' Conference, which will be held at Napa Valley College July 21-26.

Applications are now available to participate in the conference's juried workshops, with a deadline of April 22.

For the fifth anniversary of the conference's translation program, classicist Emily Wilson will explore the challenges and insights of translating work originally composed in another language with participants workshopping their translations of poetry or prose.

The Guardian called Wilson's translation of The Iliad "a bravura feat." It was featured in 2023 best books lists from the New York Times, The Atlantic, the Washington Post, Time and others. Wilson's 2017 translation of the Odyssey was also widely acclaimed.

"Adding the translation program has given the conference a new way to engage with global literature from many eras," said Executive Director Angela Pneuman.

In addition to leading workshops, Wilson and the other visiting faculty members will present literary craft lectures and readings open to the public, with individual event tickets and daily and weeklong passes available.

A drop-in poetry writing workshop and a discussion seminar spotlighting the work of faculty members will also be offered, free of charge, to the community.

"We've been broadening our community offerings in recent years, and writers and readers who don't apply to the conference's intensive workshops can opt to make a day or week of programming tailored to their interests – attending public lectures, readings and free community classes," Pneuman said.

Authors who will lead fiction and poetry workshops include Jamil Jan Kochai, author of National Book Award finalist *The Haunting of Hajji Hotak and Other Stories*, whose stories move between modern-day Afghanistan and the Afghan diaspora in America.

Joining Kochai on the fiction faculty will be Lysley Tenorio, whose novel *The Son of Good Fortune* won the New American Voices Award; Lan Samantha Chang, author of four books, including *The Family Chao* and *Hunger: A Novella and Stories*; and Peter Ho Davies, whose most recent books are the novel *A Lie Someone Told You About Yourself*, and *The Art of Revision: The Last Word*.

First-time faculty poet Jan Beatty has written seven books, among them *The Body Wars*, whose poems "simmer with luminous connection," *The New York Times* wrote. Beatty's collection *Dragstripping* is forthcoming this fall, and she is at work on a collection of essays about gender and censorship.

Other visiting faculty poets include Jane Hirshfield, whose latest collections are *The Asking* and *Ledger*; C. Dale Young, a Bay Area physician and author of five collections of poetry and Bruce Snider, author of three poetry collections.

The conference will be held at Napa Valley College. Tuition for the full week is \$1,200, with scholarships available. All scholarship and workshop applications are due April 22.
